**YCCC MEMBERSHIP MEETING  
WEDNESDAY, June 9, 2010

President Ed Naylor called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM, welcoming guests and members to the monthly meeting. A request was made that all cell phones, pagers and other communication devices be turned off or switched to vibrate mode during the course of the meeting.

**President's Report – Ed Naylor** - Ed received a call from Terry Ness from the Viking's Club that going forward the soda, ice tea, and coffee will not be free. The board decided the club will pay for the drinks at the June meeting. Going forward the Club members will be responsible for paying for their drinks. Just a reminder we have tickets available for sale for the Corvette blanket. Topper is still collecting coupons so if any members have any please bring them to the meeting.

**Vice President's Report – Dennis Jaskulski** - There were past discussions to purchase a Club trailer to make it a lot easier for the show Chair transporting the equipment to and from the shows. The trailer would already be loaded with the tables, chairs, all registration materials, the heavy concrete weights for the poles, etc... and the Chair can also load all door prizes and whatever else they need for the show. Also, all items stored in the shed can now be stored in the trailer and the Club can lose the expense of the shed. The Board made a recommendation to vote on either to purchase Mike Boyer's 8' x 20' trailer for \$3,000 or not to purchase a trailer. If we find out the trailer is too big the Club can always sell the trailer. As for insurance we can purchase insurance from the NCCC for a yearly estimate cost of \$150 for a million dollar liability insurance. There will be a yearly inspection fee of \$40. The vote count was 25 yes and 18 no. The club will be purchasing Mike's trailer.

Dennis has made a recommendation to the Club to have the 2011 Awards Banquet at the Great American Saloon in Red Lion. Estimate cost will be \$42.50 per person including a DJ. Dennis has not completed the negotiation price with the Great American Saloon. Dinner will be a buffet. There will be a cash bar for beer & Wine and an ice cream bar in the banquet room. Other adult beverages will be available from the main bar.

**Secretary's Report – Joanne Gohn** - Minutes were accepted and approved as printed. The next Board meeting will take place on Wednesday, June 23<sup>rd</sup> at Dennis Jaskulski's home. If any member

would like to attend, please inform one of the Board Members.

**Membership Report – Deb Thieret** - Deb reported that there were 88 members present and the club has 191 members. We had one guest attend the meeting, David Orwig who attended one of our shows was voted into the club that evening. Welcome David!

**Bill Culhane – Parades** - Bill thanked the members who attended the Memorial Day parades. Bill had a total of 28 cars attend.

**22 May 2010 - Harley Earl's 1963 Corvette Sells for \$925,000 -**

At Mecum's Spring Classic in Indianapolis, a capacity crowd witnessed Harley Earl's 1963 Corvette convertible sell for \$925,000. Bidding was strong throughout the auction but slowed at \$900,000. In the end it was Terry Michaelis of

[Proteam Corvette](#) who registered the final bid to win the unique Corvette that was given to Earl following his retirement from General Motors.



Having watched a lot of auctions and seeing Terry in action, this is the first we've seen him on the phone during a sale so we believe that he was acting as a proxy

for the buyer. Regardless, the Harley Earl Corvette will be the centerpiece of any Corvette collection. Interestingly, the Corvette was offered for sale last year at Bloomington Gold's 2009 auction where the Corvette registered a high bid of \$985,000. **Source: corvetteblogger.com**

**25 May 10 - Pull the Fuse on your C6 Corvette's Dual Mode Exhaust -** Since the introduction of the dual mode performance exhaust on Z06 Corvettes back in 2006, owners have been doing this very simple mod to keep the NPP's butterfly valves open so they can enjoy that deep exhaust rumble all the time. Since it's such a popular and easy mod to do, we thought we would make a quick video about the fuse and its location, as well as give you a couple of before and after sounds so you hear the difference. **Editor's Note: Go to corvetteblogger.com and check out the video, it's well done.**

After I pulled the fuse, I went for a quick cruise. While I like how the Corvette's exhaust sounds with the fuse pulled at idle, I found the experience of cruising down the highway at 70 mph in a convertible with the top down to be just a little too much. After 100 miles I pulled over and quickly reinstalled the fuse. That's why I would recommend going with one of the aftermarket solutions that allows you to turn on and off the NPP exhaust remotely. **Source: by Keith Cornett corvetteblogger.com**

**10 Jun 2010 - Corvette Values: 1963 Corvette Roadster -** JF in Florida submitted this 1963 Corvette convertible, VIN 30867S105XXX, matching numbers 327ci/360hp fuel-injected



motor. FI unit replaced with traditional carburetor and original FI unit put on shelf, non-original radiator. 4-Speed transmission, 59,406 original miles.

Saddle Tan exterior with saddle vinyl interior. Interior, carpet and chrome are all in excellent condition. Options include AM/FM radio and removable hard top. Owner history, maintenance

receipts. Restored in 1982. This Corvette has also received awards from the local Corvette club shows.

The VIN # indicates this Roadster was built in December 1963, the fourth month of the 1963 model production. The mileage of 59,406 is stated to be correct. This Roadster is powered by a rare original, matching numbers, 327-360 fuel-injected motor. Only 12% of the buyers selected this optional motor during the 1963 production year. The fuel injection unit has been replaced with a traditional carburetor, a common practice with fuel-injected Corvettes due to special tuning that is required. However, the original fuel-injection unit has been retained. Also, the radiator has been replaced with a non-stock unit. The motor is coupled with a 4-speed manual transmission that includes the original shifter and linkage. The body panels, and interior of this Corvette are original with no modifications. The paint is Saddle Tan and is in good condition. This Corvette was restored in 1982 and its appearance in an indication that it has been well cared for since that date.

The interior is Saddle vinyl, a nice match to the exterior paint. The interior door panels, seats, and carpet are in excellent condition.

The bumpers and other bright work are also classified as being in excellent condition. From an options perspective, this Corvette has the removable hard top and the AM/FM radio. The convertible top is in good condition. The wheels and hubcaps are original and in good condition as well. Owner history of this Corvette is available including most of the purchase and maintenance receipts. This Corvette has also received local Corvette Club awards.

**09 Jun 200 - Study Shows Corvette Gift to Pitcher Nets GM \$8.9 million in Media Exposure** - Last week's gift of a 2010 Corvette Grand Sport Convertible to Detroit Tigers pitcher Armando Galarraga, whose quest for a perfect game was ended by a blown call, garnered all sorts of attention for General Motors. While the detractors like The New York Times questioned the taxpayer-subsidized sports car giveaway to a professional athlete, it turns out the goodwill gesture netted GM nearly \$9 million in publicity.

The non-commissioned study was undertaken by Joyce Julius & Associates who specializes in cross-media sponsorship measurement. The Corvette gift to Galarraga generated nearly \$1 million from references in 714 television programs and \$7.9

million from over 150,000 mentions in publications and on web sites.

Going back to that same New York Times article, GM spokesman Klaus-Peter Martin was quoted last week as saying "It was probably some of the best dollars invested in publicity in Chevrolet and

spokesman agreed:

"The best way we can pay taxpayers

back is to increase our revenue, and

the only way we can

do that is to sell more vehicles. We have to spend money to do that." With a \$58,580 MSRP, the 2010 Corvette Grand Sport Convertible is one of the best selling models in the Corvette lineup. **21 Jun 10 - RM Auctions Sell Two 1969 L88 Corvettes at San Diego Sale** - RM Auctions had sold off a private collection of automobiles in Saturday's Classic Muscle and Modern Performance sale in San Diego, California. The collection was heavy on Pontiac GTOs, Corvettes and other classic muscle cars along with a nice mix of modern performance cars including an AMG tuned Mercedes-Benz and several BMWs. Two of the Corvettes that garnered much attention at the no-reserve auction were 1969 L88 Corvettes which sold for a combined \$560,000.

The first 1969 L88 Corvette was one of the last of the 116 produced and was the only one dressed in Monza Red with Saddle interior. A former drag Corvette, the high-performance Vette has only 2,265 original miles. Owned by the original purchaser up until 2005, a log book happily details the a best ¼ mile time of 10.82 seconds at 156.65 mph. One of the most superb L88 Corvettes from the era, the Corvette is a fully documented and has earned Bloomington Gold, NCRS Top Flight, and the Gold Spinner Triple Crown awards. Bidding for the Corvette was steady throughout the sale with the L88 changing hands for \$365,000.

The second L88 Corvette to cross the auction block at the Classic Muscle and Modern Performance sale was the Riverside Gold former drag car known affectionately as "Automatically Yours" as its one of only 17 L88s to be coupled to the Turbo-Hydramatic 400 automatic transmission. The Nabers Brothers of Houston were commissioned for a frame off restoration and the Corvette received a Bloomington Gold award with a 99.5/100 score. "Automatically Yours" is well known in the Corvette community and has appeared in numerous Corvette publications. The rare Corvette was sold Saturday for \$195,000.

**22 Jun 2010 Corvettes on eBay: 1972 Corvette ZR1 - The Rarest of all Small-Block Chevy Corvettes** - Most Corvette enthusiasts are familiar with the legendary L88 package which was essentially a collection of limited edition racing parts installed on the L71 427/435 hp engine. I would also say that most are not that familiar with

the 1970-72 ZR1 package which essentially did the same with the LT-1 350 ci small block. Much rarer than the 216 L88s made the three years prior, only 53 ZR1 Corvettes were produced during the three year span making them the rarest of all Chevy small blocks. So it's a pretty big deal when one shows up for sale like this 1972 Corvette ZR1 which was recently listed for sale on eBay.

Rumor has it the ZR1 RPO stood for Zora's Racer 1. There is no doubt that this special street racing package has Zora Arkus-Duntov's fingerprints all over it. As the successor to the L88 Corvette which ended production in 1969, the ZR1 package was built on top the L88 chassis utilizing the LT-1 small block. Like the L88s, the ZR1 package included the M22 Muncie Rockcrusher 4-speed heavy duty transmission, J56 heavy duty brakes, transistorized ignition, a special aluminum radiator and a special suspension that included heavy duty springs, shocks, brakes and stabilizer bars.

When the ZR1 was released in 1970, there was no fanfare, magazine comparisons or road tests like we see today. As the corporate ban on racing was still in effect, no promotion was given to a radio-delete street racer. But the back door was wide open, especially when Chevy's corporate brass were looking the other way. But word did get out to those in the know, and in 1970, 25 of these special Corvettes were sold. Over the next two years, the \$1,010 ZR1 package would see another 28 more examples make it out into the wild for a total production run of just 53 Corvettes.

This 1972 Corvette ZR1 that showed up on eBay appears to be the real deal. Featuring its original engine, drive train, interior and having just 16,295 original miles on the odometer, the



Corvette has the provenance of the original tank sticker and its originality was acknowledged by its peers by appearing in the 1999 Bloomington Gold Special Collection.

The Corvette was restored in the mid-1980's and was repainted with lacquer paint to its original color of Elkhart Green. Inside is the original saddle leather interior and like all 1970-72 Corvette ZR1's, this example is missing a radio as well as no power windows, power steering, rear window defroster or air conditioning.

The Corvette was recently relisted with a "buy it now" price of \$200,000 although offers are being accepted. The auction runs through June 28th, 2010. A premium price for a premium car for sure, but with only 53 examples of the original as well

as the success of the new C6 ZR1, I'm surprised we haven't seen more of these cars start showing up at auction. For more info or to contact the
