### YCCC Membership Meeting Minutes Wednesday, July 13, 2011

President, Bob Berkebile, called the meeting to order at 7:03 P.M.

### Officers Reports

**Secretary - Sue Briddell** - The minutes were approved as printed in the August Newsletter.

**President - Bob Berkebile** - Bob thanked Tom Folk and all members of the By-laws Committee for their work in updating the 2007 By-laws.

He read the names of members celebrating birthdays in August.

Bob also read thank you cards from Dottie Lindt, Jim Keagy and Jim Arvin.

Bob brought up the Muscle Car Madness Show that will be held July 13 & 14, 2012 as a positive issue. The YCCC has been invited back to this sanctioned show. There were no negative issues.

**Vice-President - Tom Folk** - Tom said that proposed changes to the By-laws will be posted in the September Newsletter. At the September meeting, the committee will entertain discussion and a vote will be taken by paper ballot at the October meeting.

He conducted the 50/50 drawing. Jeff Walker, Tim Emig and Linda Zullinger were winners.

**Governor - Rich Miller** - The next regional meeting of NCCC will be on September 24, 2011. Rich will need to know YCCC show dates for 2012 by then. At the regional meeting in December, shows will be finalized.

**Treasurer - Forrest Allison** - Forrest thanked the members for all of their cards, telephone calls and visits during his recent hospitalization and recovery. The caring lifted his spirit and he is grateful for all of his Corvette Club friends.

Forrest reported that the Funkhana in June made a profit of \$862. For a first time event, it was a successful show. A financial statement was placed on each table for members to peruse. Forrest asked for questions; there were none. A motion was made and seconded to pay the bills. The motion passed.

**Ed Naylor - Past-President** - Ed delineated plans for Corvettes at Carlisle, August 26-28. Ed has walk-in passes for workers not bringing their Vettes.

**Thursday, August 25** - Members available to help with set up should speak with Mike Boyer or Ed. They expect to leave York in the afternoon.

**Friday, August 26** - Members wishing to travel in convoy to Carlisle should meet at Delco Plaza at 6:00 am. Ed has gift cards for our Friday workers that may be used at any of the eating venues on the Fairgrounds.

**Saturday, August 27** - Meet at Delco Plaza at 6:00 am. to convoy together to Carlisle.

It is suggested that Carlisle Blue shirts be worn to draw attention to the Club since this is the day for judging. Pewter plates

will be Awarded - 1st place is cast, 2nd and 3rd place are engraved. Tom Folk will be preparing food for members.

**Sunday, August 28** - Meet at Delco Plaza at 7:00 am to convoy to the show.

**Membership - Anita Reigart** - There are 168 members in the Club. Seventy-four members were present at the meeting and forty-eight ate the meal. No guests attended. Dues are payable by October 31. (Anita is requesting them by October 28, if possible.) Checks should be made out to YCCC and given or mailed to Anita Reigart. (See form at end of newsletter).

**Publications - Stu Jones** - Don Zullinger is providing humorous articles for the Newsletter on a monthly basis. In August, Stu accidentally omitted the punch line. The story will be reprinted in the September Newsletter with the punch line.

**Parade Coordinator - Norma Triplett** - The YWCA Halloween Parade will be held on Sunday, October 30. (*check calendar*)

**Programs - Mike Boyer** - The flag for the Corvette Cheer was held by Darla and Larry Lentz. Mike began with a review of Club activities while he was away.

**July 30** - Boalsburg Car Show, Six cars traveled to the show. Only a few Corvettes were registered. A positive comment was that it was a "good ride." There was much discussion about the effectiveness of 7-sanction shows. Stu suggested that at the next meeting we should discuss whether YCCC should advise Rich Miller to advise NCCC that we oppose 7-sanction shows.

**July 31** - Judges' Seminar, approximately 35 people attended. Those who did thought it was a good idea and helpful.

**August 6** - Chicken Show, about 20 members attended the show and enjoyed it. It was suggested that in the future, traveling to the show as a group might be a goal.

Mike said the Canadian Tour was a "great run." Plans are in the works for a "Lap Around America Tour" in September, 2012.

**Old Business** - None.

**New Business** - This Spring a committee chaired by Tom Folk studied our governing documents and developed recommended changes. The changes were available at tables at the August meeting. They are reproduced here. At the September meeting discussions will be entertained. At the

October meeting there will be a vote on the changes. Following are the changes proposed for our club's By-Laws and Club Policy:

#### **YCCC By-Laws (last revised September 2007)**

##### **ARTICLE 2 - MEMBERSHIP AND DUES**

**Section 4** - Privileges - Members are entitled to all club privileges. *However, any member leaving the club for any reason will return all club property, all events that the member may have chaired will stay as a YCCC event. This meaning NO event can be taken away from YCCC by anyone leaving for any reason. All shall agree to this when they submit their application and become a member of YCCC.*

**Section 5** - Expulsion - Membership will automatically lapse for non-payment of dues if dues are 30 days delinquent. Any member may be expelled for the best interest of the club by a **75% 51%** majority of the members present at any regular membership meeting. However, before any such action is taken, the member shall have the opportunity to submit in writing or in person his or her position on any charge of which he or she shall be notified.

##### **ARTICLE 3 - MEETINGS AND EVENTS**

**Section 1** - Meetings - Regular meetings of the club shall be held monthly, on a day and time as selected by the Club membership. The meeting day, or time may be changed by proposing the change at a regular membership meeting, printing the proposed change in the next newsletter, and passing by a **two-thirds 51%** vote of the membership present at the next regular club meeting. An individualized monthly meeting may be changed by a **two-thirds 51%** vote of the membership present at a regular meeting, no less than two regular monthly membership meetings in advance of said meeting. Any sanctioned event that counts for perfect attendance shall be on record no less than sixty days in advance of said event.

**Section 5** - A majority vote shall rule, majority meaning (51% of the members present and/or voting). ~~One third of membership in attendance shall constitute shall constitute a quorum at any regular or special meeting.~~ However, for a vote to be taken there must a minimum of (25) members present at the business meeting.

##### **ARTICLE 5 - DUTIES OF OFFICERS**

**Section 4** - Duties of the Treasurer - The treasurer shall, subject to such conditions and restrictions as made by the Board have custody of all monies, debts and obligations belonging to the Club. All contracts, checks, drafts notes or other orders for payment shall be signed in the name of the club by the Treasurer. The treasurer shall give a report on the financial status of the Club at each regular meeting and as required at an meeting of the Board of Directors. He or she shall perform all duties incidental to his or her office. In the absence of the Treasurer, **and the** President will conduct the Treasurer's duties.

##### **ARTICLE 7 - AMENDMENTS**

**Section 1** - This constitution and By-Laws may be amended by a **two-thirds 51% vote** of the members present and voting at any regular meeting. Proposals for amendments shall be submitted in writing at any regular

meeting, and shall be read to the members and may not be voted on until next regular meeting.

##### **ARTICLE 9 - DISBURSEMENTS AND COLLECTION**

**Section 3 - (new)** *The President and/or Vice President (in the President's absences), and (2) other Board members can authorize a purchase of up to \$300. Any purchase of \$301 or more shall be approved by the membership at a membership meeting.*

##### **ARTICLE 12 - MEMBER'S AGREEMENT (New)**

**Section 1** - All members of the YCCC agree to all By-Laws and Club Policies that govern the York County Corvette Club.

##### **YCCC Club Policies (New item)**

**1.** *The Club for its business meetings will follow the following agenda: Call to order, reading of the agenda, minutes of the previous meeting, Treasurer's report, Reports of standing committees, Old Business, New Business, Open discussion from the floor for the betterment of the Club, Announcement of members birthdays, Adjournment.*

**Adjournment** - The meeting adjourned at 8:21 P.M.

**More from "the Cruiser" - More from "the Cruiser"** - I was **Cruisin'** along Carlisle Avenue and passed the York Fairgrounds. Did you know that the York Fair was the first fair (1765) to be held in the soon to be United States of America? A charter was given to the people of York by Thomas Penn, son of William. At that time the fair was a two-day agricultural market on the town commons, Penn Park. We do know that the grounds were used by troops in both the American Revolution and the War of 1812.

In 1853 a group of agricultural leaders formed the York County Agricultural Society. They then made the fair a three-day event and started to look for a new home. The society purchased seven acres in 1856 on the east side of town near what is now King Street and Queen Street.

Within days of the firing on Fort Sumter, injured Union soldiers were placed in temporary hospitals at Penn Commons and the new fairgrounds. In 1862 the Secretary of War made these hospitals permanent, so by fair time these hospitals were filled with wounded and the fair was closed until 1865.

Following the Civil War the York Agricultural Society decided the fair had once again outgrown its area and in 1888 they purchased the 73-acre site that became the current York Fairgrounds.

**02 Aug 2012 - Lance Miller's New Carlisle**



**Blue 2012 Corvette ZR1** - Carlisle Event's Lance Miller and family visited Kerbeck Corvette in Atlantic City over the weekend to pick up their new Carlisle Blue 2012 Corvette ZR1. In addition to sporting the special color paying homage to the 30th anniversary of Corvettes at Carlisle, the ZR1 also comes equipped with the new PDE Performance Package which adds the Cup wheels, Michelin PS Cup tires, full width racing style spoiler and the MH3 Close Ratio transmission. Lance said he wasn't 100% sure about the new Carlisle Blue color, but once he saw it in person he realized it shows the lines of the vehicle well. "Pictures don't do it justice...", Lance writes on the Corvette Forum. He added "After seeing it in person I'm really happy with our choice."

The PDE Performance Package comes with a Black cup wheels, but Lance opted for the upgrade to the Machine Face wheels. Kerbeck's Dave Salvatore also chimes regarding the new transmission calling the gear shifter "insane" and says "That is how a supercar should feel when you are shifting it!".said said
